HE most striking feature of these tractors is their sleek streamlined A exterior, which in these views includes the rounded cowling over the steering wheel (extra equipment). Unlike most tractors, these Orchard and Grove models have no projections and no crevices to catch branches and tear fruit off when run close to the trees. Although completely shielded for the protection of trees and fruit they are nevertheless as accessible as any tractor you ever worked with. It is only a moment's job to raise the hood sides or remove the engine cover and grille in order to inspect or adjust important parts.

Then when you look beneath that "functionally streamlined" exterior you find a lot of things to please you too - a simple, compact, sweet-running tour-cylinder engine; a five-speed transmission; a variable speed governor controlled from the seat; foot-operated steering brakes; and many other features which you will see illustrated and described farther on in this catalog.

The O-4, illustrated above, is the smaller of the two tractors. In an open field it would plow at the rate of 7 to 12 acres a day, double-disk 25 to 30 acres, or harrow (spring tooth) 20 to 25 acres. Equipped with belt pulley and power take-off it provides ample power for medium-size hammer mills, fertilizer mixers, sprayers, dusters, and other machines. Fuel consumption is from 15 to 20 gallons a day.
